Ranking

Ranking recognizes the accomplishment of an individual within the Buddhai Sawan system of combat arts and grants them certain privileges within the system. Ranking does not automatically confer specific status or role within the system or within an organization.



Grade Requirements

All requirements represent a <u>minimum</u> set of requirements for that grade. Student aptitude and previous experience will determine actual skill set.

White Sash Requirements

- 8 and 7 counts as minimum requirements on double sword novice competence
- Basic Muay Boran or Muay Thai striking
 - Kicks, knees, elbows, punches
- Basic movements of four directions full ram muay not required
- Basic knowledge of structure, posture, movement
- Basic stepping, weight drop with striking and blocking
- Basic terminology for strikes, counting
- Salute, terms for instructor, students

Green Sash Requirements

- Intermediate skill in applied core mechanics for striking, blocking, movement
- Intermediate skill with all counts for double sword and one long weapon (spear or staff)
- Basic skill in Wai khru ram muay for a short weapon OR long weapon
- Novice skill in Muay Boran or similar (kicks, knees, elbows, punches, clinch, throws)
- Novice skill in at least one other weapon
- Able to flow short combinations
- Novice skill sparring with at least one weapon

Blue Sash Requirements

- Intermediate skill with 8,7,3 and 9 counts for double sword, staff, single sword, spear or halberd
- Intermediate skill in Wai khru ram muay for double sword plus basic skill in a second short weapon AND a long weapon
- Intermediate Muay Boran (kicks, knees, elbows, punches, clinch, throws)
- Intermediate skill for choreographed fight (bang) for at least one weapon
- Variations with counts, improvisation
- Novice familiarity shield or mai sowks
- Intermediate skill sparring with at least two weapons

Red Sash Requirements

- Advanced skill with 8,7,3 and 9 counts for double sword, staff, single sword, spear or halberd
- Advanced skill in wai khru ram muay for double sword plus intermediate skill in a second short weapon AND a long weapon
- Intermediate Muay Boran (kicks, knees, elbows, punches, clinch, throws)
- Advanced skill for choreographed fight (bang) for at least two weapons or advanced skill sparring with at least two weapons
- Variations with counts, improvisation
- Basic skill with shield or mai sowks

Silver Sash Requirements

- Complete skill with 8,7,3 and 9 counts for double sword, staff, single sword, spear or halberd
- General aptitude for mixed drills, variations in counts, improvisation
- Advanced skill in wai khru ram muay for at least four weapons
- Intermediate Muay Boran (kicks, knees, elbows, punches, clinch, throws)
- Advanced skill for choreographed demo (bang) or sparring in multiple weapons
- Basic variations with counts, improvisation
- Intermediate skill with shield and mai sowks

Gold Sash - 1st Degree (gold w/1 yellow stripe) Requirements

• Complete skill with all count and variations for most weapons

- General aptitude for improvisation, material development, restructuring
- Advanced skill in wai khru ram muay for at least four weapons
- Intermediate or advanced Muay Boran (kicks, knees, elbows, punches, clinch, throws)
- Expert skill for choreographed demo (bang) or sparring in multiple weapons
- Speciality skill with one of shield, short sword or sabre, short spear

APPENDIX: Color Meaning

White (Grade 1) is representative of the principles of purity, but it is also considered the colour of knowledge and longevity. It is considered a colour of extremes, associated with the cold of snow and the smelting of metal. White is associated with the Buddha Vairocana. According to Buddhist legend, Buddha's mother, Maya, dreamt of a white elephant touching her right side before Buddha was born. Elephants, associate with rain clouds and fertility, are seen as good fortune, and following that the elephant was white - that meant purity and learnedness for the child. Because of this dream, seeing a white elephants spells remarkable fortune, which holds truth whether in reference to mysticism or not, as they are quite rare. The white elephant is thought to be Buddha descended from the heavens. The current Thai flag, adopted in 1917, claims that white represents the purity of the Buddhist faith.

Yellow (not used) is the colour that possesses the highest symbolic quality because of the saffron colour of the monks' robes. Chosen as a symbol of humility and separation from materialistic society. It symbolizes renunciation and desirelessness. Because it is also the colour of the earth, yellow denotes stability and grounded nature. This is also the color of the Thai King. In the context of a beginner, it could be inferred as a student becoming part of something and paying tribute to the King by becoming a practitioner of the art.

Green (Grade 2) denotes youth, vigour, action (Karma), and harmony. Because it is the colour at the middle of the spectrum, it is also represents balance and is associated visually with the lush trees.

Blue (Grade 3) represents tranquility, ascension, the infinite, purity, and healing. Over all, the colour represents wisdom. The current Thai flag, adopted in 1917, claims that blue represents the Thai monarchy. The blue stripe also has a double meaning as it stands in solidarity and honours Thailand's World War I allies, namely Great Britain, France, the United States and Russia, which all have red, white and blue flags.

Red (Grade 4) symbolizes lifeforce, preservation, fire, and sacred things or places. Also riddled with duality, fire can represent warmth and comfort, but can also be a destructive force. Red is associated with the Buddha Amitabha. Throughout Tibetan culture, red is a marker of sacred areas. We also see this colour on the garments on the monks. It is believed to be a protective colour. The current Thai flag, adopted in 1917, claims that red is to symbolize the blood of life.

Silver (Grade 5) silver is not mentioned within Buddhist or Thai colors. Our assumption is that silver comes before Gold in terms of precious metals or value? Or, since silver may signify purity or share similarities with White as it's in the same realm of color...

Gold with Buddhist Rainbow (Grade 6) The main symbolism of gold is either the sun or fire. The sun is one of the purest and most revered energy sources in our solar system and is

regularly recognized in Buddhism. Gold is a universal symbol for knowledge, happiness, purity, enlightenment and freedom. Traits and feelings that everyone desires. The most prominent colour concept in Buddhism is that of the rainbow (body, which is the highest level of meditative achievement wherein the body is transformed into pure light. The rainbow body is the highest achievement other than Nirvana, which is the essential end-goal for Buddhists. Since the "pure light" on the spectrum contains all colors, and is white, to possess a rainbow body means to possess all colors, and to do so means meditating on colors that embody specific teachings.

The Buddhai Sawan not only look for techniques or physical attributes but for the interest and energy that you put into it, to learn the whole aspect with respects to the culture, art, vocabulary, ceremony and prayers.

Also one of the very important parts is the spiritual part. Based in my observation the Arjarn will put you or ask you to do things, that in the first moment looks strange but afterwards you will understand. They look at your personality, to see how you are, how much help you are willing to give, how you teach another's students...In other words Who is the person that lives behind your body.

*The training involve 326 hours to be Gold Sash; After that the institution will give you the Gold sash number that they think that you have earned. **Based on your personality, in the number of shows that you been and how many times per year you been in the Institute. Some people just one, and some people every year.***

Gold Sash 1st Degree: This belt is gold color with one yellow stripe.

Gold Sash 2nd Degree: This belt is gold color with 2 stripes, one yellow and on top blue.

Gold Sash 3rd Degree: This belt is gold color with 3 stripes, one yellow, one blue and one red.

Gold Sash 4th Degree: This belt is gold color with 4 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and one gold.

Gold sash 5th Degree:

This belt is gold color with 5 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and two gold stripes.

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Gold Sash 6th Degree:

This belt is gold color with 6 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and three gold stripes on top.

Gold Sash 7th Degree:

This belt is gold color with 7 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and four gold stripes on top.

Gold Sash 8th Degree. (Master): This belt is gold color with 8 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and five gold stripes on top.

Gold Sash 9th Degree. (Grand Master): This belt is gold color with 9 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and six gold stripes on top.

Gold Sash 10th Degree. (Only the Prince of Thailand): This belt is gold color with 10 stripes, one yellow, one blue, one red and seven gold stripes on top.

Gold Sash 11th Degree. (Only the King of Thailand). This belt is completely gold color without any stripe
